



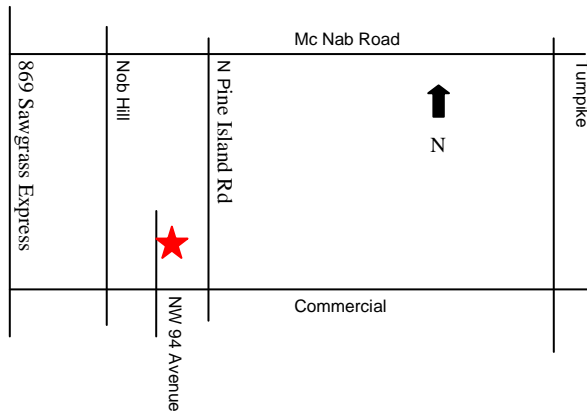

Please be prepared for an emergency evacuation and have the following ready to go with you when it is time to evacuate to the shelter:

#### ***For you and your family***

- Proof of residence (latest FPL bill, utilities or phone bill...)
- Medications
- Baby food and diapers (if needed)
- Battery operated radio
- Car keys
- Blankets, pillows, and/or sleeping bags
- Change of clothing
- Drinking water
- First aid kit
- Favorite toys or blanket for kids
- Glasses and/or contact lenses
- Identification and valuable papers
- Non-perishable food (24 hour supply)
- One flashlight
- Personal toiletries (soap, toothpaste, etc.)

#### ***Do not bring***

- Furniture, weapons, alcoholic beverages or drugs

#### ***For your pet*** (unfortunately, we cannot guarantee the return of any items brought to the shelter)

- Proof of rabies vaccination
- Food (*it is better for pets to continue on their regular diet*)
- Medications
- Toys
- Favorite towel or blanket
- Collar and leash (non-retractable)
- Muzzle (if necessary)

Although rabies is the only required vaccination, it is strongly recommended that your pet be up to date on all vaccinations recommended by your veterinarian, such as but not limited to: parvo, heart worm, distemper, kennel cough and feline leukemia. Pets should also be on a continuous flea and tick prevention program.

Pets must be crated and will be housed in the same area as other pets. Pet owners must stay at the emergency shelter and by appointment only, provide care for their animals (i.e., walking, feeding, cleaning up after). Pet owners are not be allowed to sleep or stay in the room where their animals are housed.

**\*\*\*Please mark all papers with owner name, pet name and phone number in case there is a problem with information**

**List of things to bring to the pet friendly hurricane shelter;**

**\*\*\*Mark your name on everything.**

**\*\**Please bring dogs on leaches***

**\*\**all cats MUST be in a carrier***

\*Own bedding; air mattress, cot, sleeping bag, etc. along with blankets and pillows

\*Own food; snacks or anything needed for a special diet.

(we will have school like meals)

\*Baby food/ kids food and snacks,

\*special dog & cat foods. We only feed purina

\*Something for you & kids to do; books, magazines, coloring books, etc..

\*Flashlights / phone chargers

\*All medicine; human and pets.

\*some clothes for a day or so. (bring a bag for dirty things)

\*Put all important papers in a baggie properly marked with your name and secure with your belongings.

\*\* There will be assigned time for feeding and walking. The staff will control all times and Times can change depending on the number of pets boarded.

**Evacuation Plan**

**A**

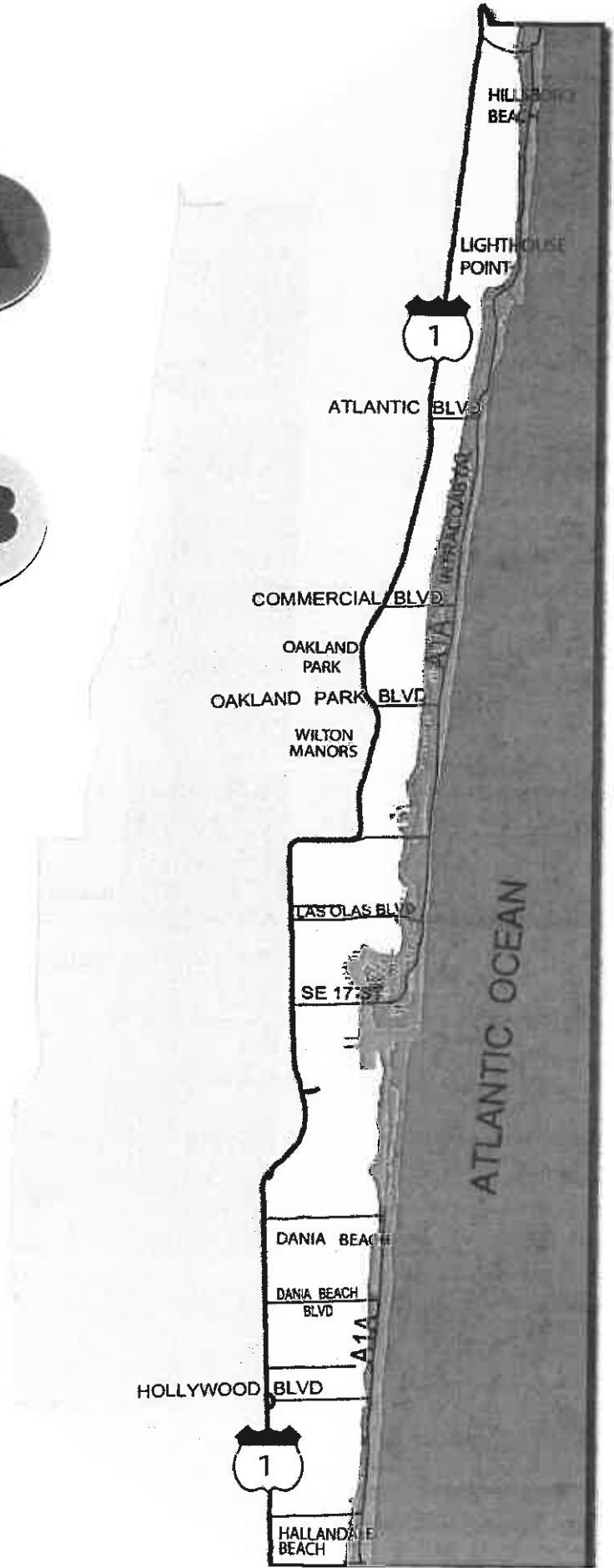
All residents east of the Intracoastal Waterway, mobile home residents, residents beside tidal bodies of water and in low-lying areas should evacuate.

**Evacuation Plan**

**B**

All residents east of U.S. 1 (Federal Highway), mobile home residents, residents beside tidal bodies of water and in low-lying areas should evacuate.

- If you live in an evacuation zone and an evacuation is ordered, you are required by law to evacuate.
- Leave when local government officials issue a mandatory evacuation order for your area.
- Evacuate to a family or friend's home or hotel outside the evacuation area. Shelters provide for basic needs only and are a choice of last resort.
- Tell someone outside the storm area where you are going.
- Take your hurricane kit and important papers with you.

**Pet-Friendly Shelter**

**■ PLAN A Evacuation**    **□ PLAN B Evacuation**

Typically a Category 1-2 hurricane.    Typically a Category 3 or higher hurricane.

Those persons located in low lying areas or beside tidal bodies of water should seek shelter elsewhere if conditions warrant. ALL mobile home residents must evacuate in PLAN A and PLAN B. In addition, mobile home residents may be ordered to evacuate if tropical storm conditions warrant.
